Health Services

- Family Health Services
 - Check-ups for well child growth & development
 - Check-ups for Women (MediPass participants)
 - Family Planning
 - Immigration Physicals
 - School Physicals
 - Sick Care (children under 18 & MediPass participants)
- Immunizations
 - Free immunizations for eligible children
 - Flu & pneumonia vaccinations

Eligibility

The **Escambia County Health Department** offers a wide range of clinical services. Many of these services are provided free of charge to residents of Escambia County. Some services have fees that are based on household income. We accept private insurance, Medicaid and Medicare. A financial interview is conducted to determine eligibility and the client's portion of fees. All children are eligible to receive required childhood vaccinations at no charge.

Eligibility appointments can be made by calling 850-595-6554. Please bring proof of household income, proof of child day care paid by working parents, and any Medicaid, Medicare or other insurance cards to your appointment.

Health services are provided in clinics, schools, homes, communities, and other areas. Emphasis is placed on quality care with all programs participating in quality assurance audits on a regular basis.

Healthy Environment

A safe and healthy environment is crucial to the well-being of each individual. Environmental Health programs are aimed at preventing and reducing health risks that may occur in our daily surroundings.

- Testing of drinking water
- Inspections of mobile home & recreational vehicle parks
- Inspection and testing of public beaches & public swimming pools
- Inspection of septic tank & sewage disposal systems
- Inspection of schools & other institutions (group homes, day care centers, etc)
- Regulation of bio-hazardous waste disposal
- Investigation of possible rabies exposures
- Investigation of food-borne or water-borne illness
- Petroleum site inspection & clean-up

Vital Records

- Birth and death certificates
- Family tree searches (genealogy)
- Information on obtaining certificates from other Florida counties and other states
- Repository of local and state statistical data

Public Health Preparedness

- Coordinate health/medical facilities in developing a unified response plan for terrorist or other disaster events
- Train and educate medical providers and others concerning potential disease threats & chemical/radiological decontamination.
- Disaster response & special needs shelters

Medical Reserve Corps

- Engage local professional healthcare volunteers to respond to certain emergencies
- Supplement & assist local medical emergency response systems at special needs shelters
