November Radio Ad: 60 seconds

(Sounds of office work going on in the background)

Reader 1 (man): Sara, you don't look like you feel well today.

Reader 2 (woman): I don't. My head hurts, muscles ache, throat is sore, I have a fever, and I am so tired. (cough sound)

Reader 1: Sounds like you might be coming down with something. Do you think you have the flu?

Reader 2: Is it flu season already?

Reader 1: Yes, it started in October and usually lasts through March.

Reader 2: I sure hope I don't have the flu, but I should probably go home because I don't want to spread my germs and get anyone else in the office sick.

Reader 1: Sounds like a good idea! (Fade out conversation with new voice)

Reader 3:

Yes, it's flu season again and it is estimated that 10 to 20 percent of Americans will come down with the flu this year.

Don't let the flu get you down.

Get your flu shot, wash your hands often, and make sure you cough or sneeze into your elbow, not your hands. Also, keep your work area clean and disinfected to prevent germs from spreading.

If you think you might be coming down with the flu you should:

Stay home, get lots of rest, drink plenty of fluids and if symptoms persist or worsen see your physician.
