Announcer: Your child needs a 4<sup>th</sup> DTaP vaccination at 15 to 18 months. Getting the fourth vaccination is an important step in protecting your child from whooping cough, also known as pertussis, as well as tetanus and diphtheria. These diseases can cause serious sickness and even death. The 4<sup>th</sup> DTaP shot is available at the health department or you can contact your child's pediatrician.
